

1. Introduction and Routine Cleaning

Like all outdoor products, your Buckley kitchen has to prevail against variating weather conditions. With this in mind, caring for your outdoor kitchen is extremely important. Rest in confidence, our kitchens have been designed using top quality materials, to standup to all Britsh weather. However, to protract the lifespan of your kitchen, regular maintenance is recommended, this ensures that your outdoor kitchen is always looking in excellent condition all the time.

Routine Cleaning:

For porcelain work surfaces and metal work, a simple wipedown with a sponge, warm water and a mild detergent (soapy liquid) will be sufficient before every use. Any spills such as, food, wine and sauces should be removed speedily to avoid any long-term staining.

2. Step-by- step Assembly Guidelines

This manual has been designed to give specific information on how to assembly your new kitchen, you'll find step-by-step instructions to make sure your kitchen is installed correctly. Make sure you have the correct tools at hand and some drilling will be required!

Although our kitchens are designed to be as simple as possible for you to assembly yourself, please take into consideration some pumping, gas and electical installation will be require on certain poducts.

Please read these instructions carefully prior to assembly and use.

- Make sure all plastic protection is removed before assembling.
- · Assembly of the product involves some large components; it is advisable to have two people assemble the unit.
- Find a large, clean area to assemble your product.
- Assembly should be carried out on an open, flat, level surface.
- Please refer to the parts list and assembly diagram as necessary.
- To avoid losing any small component or hardware, assemble your product on a hard level surface that does not have cracks or openings.
- To prevent any possible damage to the flooring structure, ensure this product is correctly lifted, whilst been moved from one position to another.
- Follow all steps in order to properly assemble your product.
- Wear correct safety gloves and glasses. Edges and corners can cause minor cuts if improperly handled during assembly, some drilling will be required.
- Do not force parts together as this can result in damage to the product.
- When applicable, tighten all components by hand first. Once all steps are completed, go back and fully tighten till firmly secure with the recommended handtool.

3. Site Preparation and Utility Access Holes

The first stage of installing a kitchen is preparation and ensuring the area is clean, has a level solid surface, all (NG) gas, plumbling and electrics services are in a safe and conventient location. Your utility kitchen cabinets match-up to your service connection points. Layouts may require cabinets to be modified to allow access for supplies. With this in mind our Buckley outdoor kiutch cabinets have pre-drilled holes in the rear panel and through the floor. Removal plastic covers can be removed if your connecting from the rear.

Any un-needed packaging should be pleaced in the bin or recycled.


NOTE: IF YOU ARE INSTALLING A GAS BBQ, ENSURE THAT THE SITE AREA YOU HAVE CHOSEN IS WELL VENTILATED, AND A SAFE DISTANCE FROM ANY FLAMMABLE MATERIALS FOR EXAMPLE LOW HANGING TREES OR BUSHES. PRE-ASSEMBLED PARTS MUST NOT BE ALTERED BY THE USER.

4. Check List - Unpacking Your Kitchen

Once your kitchen arrives, carefully check off your delivery to see everything is in order. Pay attention not to scratch, misplace any hardware and assessories whilst you unpack. We suggest using a none-scratch material to place all the doors and worktops on the ground.

Note: Take care when removing the cabinet off the pallet, by first removing the four shipping brackets secured by eight screws, as illustrated below.



5. Preparing for Installation and Cabinet Screw-in Feet Adjustment



Step 1: Preparing for Installation

Begin by checking the levelness of your floor using a spirit level, we recommend you keep the floor gradient to an absolute minimum to ensure your kitchen is as level as possible. Identify high and low spots across the area where the cabinet will be installed. By starting off from the lowest point you can then adjust the outer cabinet screw-in feet "A" at the higher floor levels,

Note: Typically, contractors will advise you can use the industry standard ratio for fall of 1:80 as a minimal fall on your patio.

Step 2: Adjusting the Screw-in Feet

Initial Adjustment: Adjust all corner feet "A" at each location shown, to make the cabinet top level. Our adjustable feet can be twisted using a 5mm Allen key for precise height modifications.

Align and Repeat: Move the cabinet to its intended location and place a spirit level on top. Adjust each leg until the bubble indicates a perfectly level position. It is important to adjust each leg, so that the cabinet is level both front-to-back and side-to-side. Once all outer feet are level you can adjust the inner feet "B" if required.

If your floor area has got a greater fall than stated, we would strongly recommend that your Buckley Outdoor Kitchen is installed to simply run with the fall. Otherwise you will end up with a gap at one end which will potentially look unsightly. By doing this, it will help with prevention of water pooling.


Note: Another prevention to help stop water pooling, is having a smooth worktop surface finish, which requires a lot less fall, hence our material choice of smooth porcelain.




COMPLETED CABINETS ARE DIFFICULT TO MOVE AND COULD CAUSE INJURY AND DAMAGE TO THE PRODUCT.



NOW YOU HAVE POSTIONED AND LEVELLED THE FIRST CABINET, TO JOIN A SECOND CABINET. MARK AND DRILL TWO HOLES 7MM THROUGH THE OUTSIDE SKIN SIDE PANEL, AT LOCATIONS SHOWN, USING THE JIG PROVIDED.

TOOLS REQUIRED: POWER DRILL 4MM ALLEN KEY SPIRIT LEVEL






LOCATE SECOND PANEL, POSTION AND LEVEL, FOLLOWING PREVIOUS INSTRUCTIONS. DRILLING TWO HOLES 7MM FROM OUTSIDE SIDE MATING PANEL, LOCATE AND SECURE USING FIXING KIT PROVIDED, FULLY TIGHTEN.



7. Cabinet Door and Hinges Installation








FIG.1 ENSURE THAT DOORS ARE PLACED ON FLAT SCTRATCH FREE SURFACE, WHILE FITTING DOOR HINGES.

NOTE: ON METAL DOORS REMOVE REAR EXPANSION PLUG FIRST. FIG.2 ATTACH MOUNTING PLATE IN THR CORRECT ORIENTATION USING FIXING SCREWS PROVIDE, FULLY TIGHTEN. AS SHOWN ABOVE.



LOCATE CABIN DOOR AND ATTACH DOOR HINGE PLATE TO INSIDE FRONT END MOUNTING PLATE, USING A PUSH AND CLICK MOTION, AT LOCATION SHOWN ABOVE. NOTE: DOOR REMOVAL, USE QUICK RELEASE LEVER.


NOTE: OPTIONAL ON / OFF SMOOTH CLOSING DOOR SWITCH.













LOCATE FLOOR SHELF AND CAREFULLY SLIDE INTO POSITION, RESTING ON LOWER SHELF CLIPS X4, REPEAT PROCEEDER FOR UPPER SHELF, AS SHOWN ABOVE.






















SECURE BAR UNIT TO CABINET USING SELF TAPPING SCREWS 0270-196 X8 LOCATIONS. REPOSITION PANEL FROM THE TOP, SECURE WITH BOLT FIXINGS 0270-188. FINALLY LOCATE BAR WORKTOP AND SECURE WITH SEALANT, AS SHOWN ABOVE.




